M1. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES FOR THE AUGUST 25, 2015 REGULAR COUNCIL</u> MEETING.

RS1. A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CITY'S THIRD QUARTERLY INVESTMENT REPORT FOR THE QUARTER ENDING JUNE 30, 2015.

<u>BRIEF</u>: Chapter 2256.023 of the Texas Government Code states that a written quarterly investment report must be prepared by the investment officers and submitted to the governing body. The report should cover investment transactions for all funds covered by the Act for the preceding quarter.

RS2. A RESOLUTION APPROVING INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH JOHNSON COUNTY FOR THEIR ANNUAL CONTRIBUTION TO CITY/COUNTY TRANSPORTATION.

BRIEF: City/County Transportation needs to renew its annual interlocal agreement with Johnson County for their annual contribution to the program. The County requested in December of 2011 to enter into an interlocal agreement with the City of Cleburne each year, since the annual contribution is based on population, and is subject to fluctuate due to population changes. Each year, Johnson County contributes funds to the daily operation of City/County Transportation. These funds assist City/County Transportation with the local match portion that is required by our Federal grant funds. Johnson County's annual contribution for FY 2016 will be \$53,689.00. The Interlocal Agreement will be submitted to Johnson County Commissioners' Court for approval prior to expiration of the current agreement, which is 9/30/15.

vote of 5-0.

OR1. *CONTINUE PUBLIC HEARING FROM 08/25/15*

REZONING 805 BRAZOS AVENUE (BEING .2893 ACRES, ORIGINAL CLEBURNE)
FROM C1 (LOCAL BUSINESS) TO C2 (GENERAL BUSINESS); AS REQUESTED BY
DIANA REYES.

BRIEF: The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this at its August 10, 2014 meeting. This was postponed at the August 25, 2015 City Council meeting. This is to accommodate a restaurant. The surrounding zoning is C1 (Local Business District), SF-4 (Single-Family Dwelling District), MF (Multiple-Family Housing District), D (Duplex Dwelling District) and M1 (Light Industrial District). The Comprehensive Land Use Plan shows this area to be Center City East. The surrounding area is Center City East and Transportation and Industry. Notifications were sent out to a 200' radius and there were inquiries but no objections. P&Z recommended approval of the rezone by a vote of 4-2 with Dr. Bond and Ms. Chandler voting against the rezone.

OR2. *PUBLIC HEARING* AN ORDINANCE REZONING 3.54 ACRES (LOCATED AT GRANBURY STREET AND PHILLIPS STREET) FROM SF4 (SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING) TO T (TOWNHOUSE); AS REQUESTED BY RBMW, LLC.

BRIEF: The purpose for this is to accommodate single-family attached residences. The zoning for the surrounding property is SF-4 (Single-Family Dwelling District), D (Duplex or Two-Family Dwelling District), M1 (Light Industrial) and CO (Non-Retail District). The Comprehensive Land Use Plan shows this area to be Traditional Neighborhoods. The surrounding land use is Traditional Neighborhoods and Center City North. The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this request on August 24, 2015 and recommended approval of the rezone with a vote of 5-0.

OC3. *PUBLIC HEARING* APPROVE REPLAT OF LOTS 1 THRU 23, BLOCK 1, GRANBURY PHILLIPS ADDITION (BEING 3.54 ACRES AT GRANBURY STREET AND PHILLIPS STREET); AS REQUESTED BY RBMW LLC, REPRESENTED BY MATT POWELL.

BRIEF: The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this at its August 24, 2015 meeting. The purpose for this plat is to create twenty-three residential lots. The zoning for the surrounding property is SF-4 (Single-Family Dwelling District) and D (Duplex Dwelling District). The Comprehensive Land Use Plan shows this area to be Traditional Neighborhoods. The surrounding land use is Traditional Neighborhoods and Center and Center City North. P&Z recommended approval of the plat by a vote of 5-0.

OC4. *PUBLIC HEARING* APPROVE FINAL PLAT OF LOT 4R, BLOCK 3, CHOATE ADDITION (BEING .42 ACRES IN C CHANEY SURVEY, LOCATED AT 1202 AND 1204 EAST HENDERSON STREET); AS REQUESTED BY RICK AND T'RESA WEAVER, REPRESENTED BY TRANS TEXAS SURVEYING.

BRIEF: The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this at its August 24, 2015 meeting. The purpose for this plat is to create one commercial lot. The zoning for the surrounding property is C3 (Commercial District), D (Duplex Dwelling District) and SF-4 (Single-Family Dwelling District). The Comprehensive Land Use Plan shows this area to be Central Corridor. The surrounding land use is Central Corridor, Local Node and Village. P&Z recommended approval of the plat by a vote of 5-0.

OC5. *PUBLIC HEARING* APPROVE FINAL PLAT OF LOT 1R, BLOCK 1, SOLOMON'S ADDITION (BEING .496 ACRES LOCATED AT 496 PARK STREET); AS REQUESTED BY ASHLEY AND ANDY LAWRENCE.

BRIEF: The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this at its August 24, 2015 meeting. The purpose for this plat is to create one residential lot. The zoning for this property and surrounding property is SF-4 (Single-Family Dwelling District). The Comprehensive Land Use Plan shows this area and surrounding area to be Center City East. P&Z recommended approval of this plat by a vote of 5-0.

OC6. *PUBLIC HEARING* HOLD 2ND PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE DISCUSSION OF THE FY 2015-2016 PROPOSED TAX RATE OF \$.804018 PER \$100 OF VALUATION, AS REQUIRED BY CHAPTER 26 OF THE TEXAS TAX CODE.

<u>BRIEF</u>: Chapter 26, Texas Property Tax Code requires taxing units to comply with "Truth-in – Taxation" laws in setting tax rates. The calculated FY 2015-2016 effective tax rate is \$0.774420. The proposed rate for FY 2015-2016 is \$0.804018 per \$100 of valuation. On August 11, 2015,

the City Council adopted a resolution stating its intent to adopt a tax rate of \$0.804018. This rate is unchanged from FY 2014-2015, and, if adopted, would be the third straight year with this proposed tax rate. As this current and proposed tax rate of \$0.804018 is higher than the effective tax rate of \$0.774420, legislation requires that the City Council hold two public hearings to provide the public the opportunity to speak on the proposed tax rate. The first of the two public hearings on the proposed tax rate was held on Tuesday, August 25, 2015. This is the second meeting. As required by law, the City published the attached "Notice of 2015 Tax Year Proposed Property Tax Rate for the City of Cleburne" on August 14, 2015 in the Cleburne Times-Review. As a point of reference, the effective tax rate sets the interest and sinking rate (Debt Service rate) at \$0.147800. The remainder of the tax rate of \$0.656218 will be allocated to operations and maintenance (General Fund rate). The ordinance adopting the FY 2015-2016 tax rate will reflect these rates, as required by the effective tax rate calculation. The proposed FY 2015-2016 tax rate is scheduled for City Council adoption at the regularly scheduled council meeting on September 22, 2015.
